## Intermediate Hebrew I 3A03 Syllabus

### **Course Description**

With the primary goal of increasing reading fluency, this course in classical (biblical) Hebrew will lead the student through a variety of texts from multiple genres in the Hebrew Bible. As students gain familiarity with the various styles of biblical Hebrew, they will also deepen their knowledge of Hebrew syntax, solidify their comprehension of the Hebrew verbal system, and expand their biblical Hebrew vocabulary. Additionally, they shall listen to recordings of the assigned readings and practice hearing and reading biblical Hebrew aloud in order to facilitate the internalization of the language.

Students will also require access to a lexicon and reference grammar. Two standard options, *Brown, Driver, Brigg's Hebrew Lexicon* (BDB) and *Gesenius's Hebrew Grammar* (GKC), are public domain and can be purchased relatively inexpensively or downloaded for free from archive.org.

#### **Evaluation**

Class Preparation/Participation: 35%

Students will be expected to attend class (1) having listened to the translation assignment at <a href="http://depts.washington.edu/bibheb/hebrew\_audiobible.html">http://depts.washington.edu/bibheb/hebrew\_audiobible.html</a> sufficient times to feel comfortable with the pronunciation of the text and to gain some aural recognition of the language; (2) having produced their own translation of the assigned text for that day in part by working carefully through Ben Zvi; (3) having completed any assigned secondary readings (i.e., Williams) and able to relate them to the translation assignment; and (4) having covered the morphology and vocabulary review/acquisition requirement for that day. Classes will be interactive and students will earn their participation mark by demonstrating in class that they have come prepared.

*Tests*: 45%

Three tests will be written in class. These tests will cover the translation passages assigned from Ben Zvi, material treated in the readings, and vocabulary and morphology acquisition. Details as follows:

- Test 1. Material covered in Ben Zvi; words occurring more than 100 times; morphology of Strong Verb
- 2. Material covered in Ben Zvi since last test; words occurring 100-66 times; morphology of Weak and Irregular Verbs
- 3. Material covered in Ben Zvi since previous test; words occurring 65-50 times; morphology of Weak and Irregular Verbs, cont'd

## Final: 20%

The final exam, to be comprehensive, will consist of an oral examination, about 45 minutes in length.
