### Main points so far

- Sharp and Unusual (Internationally) Fall in Canadian Senior Below-LIM Rates since 1970
- Much clearer at 50% LIM Threshold than at 60% LIM Threshold
- Senior-specific (not matched by similar reductions for general population or for families with children)

#### **Rest of talk:**

- Canada senior below LIM rate = 5.9%
- Can we "decompose" this 5.9%? Are there specific groups disproportionately below-LIM?
- (analysis below was also largely done with Low-Income Cutoff with similar results)

Important study: *Death of a Spouse: The Impact on Income for Senior Men and Women* by André Bernard and Chris Li, Statistics Canada

- uses tax data
- widowers below-LIM rate about 1% at time of loss, climbs to about 4% 5 years later
- widows below-LIM rate about 1% at time of loss, climbs to about 8% 5 years later
- similar numbers for entry into below-LIM
- main reason for difference: reduction in private pensions (but in each case loss of earnings and Old Age Security important)

## My goal

• use same tax data (Longitudinal Administrative Database, 20% sample of all taxfilers, close to 5 million records per year) to extend this examination to other groups

# **Shortcomings**

- Income poverty
- Home ownership
- Living with younger adults (In SLID, this lowers below LIM rate from 4.8% to 3.5%)

#### **Broad conclusions**

# Higher below-LIM rate associated with

- Gender (higher for females)
- Loss of spouse (death, divorce, separation), particularly for women
- Being never married
- Being an immigrant (especially recent)!!!
- (Probably) not living with children
- Not much with age
- The married, nonimmigrant rate is about 3%, about half the overall rate
