All of our placements are offered within a 100 km radius of McMaster.

REQUIREMENTS FOR FIELD INSTRUCTION

- a BSW, MSW or MA (SWP)
- two years post degree practice experience
- an interest in teaching/mentoring students
- one Level 1 Field Instructors course offered at no charge by the School within the first 2 years of instructing

* In settings where an experienced staff member does not have a social work degree but is willing to act as a Field Instructor the School will arrange for the student to be co-instructed by a "mentor" who holds a BSW, MSW or MA (SWP)
